12. CONTRIBUTIONS TO KNOWLEDGE

Generally, Prof Tee's contributions to knowledge have been in the area of research that have provided solutions to the wise management and utilization of forest resources and hence improved human welfare and livelihood options. Thus;

Prof Tee, Terver Norbert has shown through research that Forests resources are scarce and limited in supply, and their sustainability is threatened by the increasing human population, changing socio-economic structures and livelihood activities (industrialization, natural resources exploration, farming, settlements and other development efforts). However, he maintained through his studies on forest products marketing published locally and internationally that the efficient marketing of these forest resources will engender their wise use and sustainable management regimes.

Prof Tee has also demonstrated through research how efficient forest products marketing system can bring about sustainable livelihood options to the poor rural communities. His socio-economic studies have further demonstrated clearly how poverty could be drastically reduced in the rural and urban communities in Nigeria and beyond applying efficient forest products marketing models.

Furthermore, Prof Tee has copiously demonstrated the instrumentality of data on gender studies in the effective and sustainable management and utilization of forest resources. He has also shown how gender analyses and marketing approaches could be utilized in solving problems posed to humanity by the changing climate.
